Summer Opportunities

In May 2025, we will be posting all summer opportunities at torontocas.ca/careers. Positions are 35 hours per week and often 8-12 weeks long.

These positions are funded by Service Canada, and as per their funding requirements, all successful candidates need to meet all of the following criteria at the start of employment:

- Between 15 and 30 years of age;
- A Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act;
- Legally entitled to work according to Ontario legislation and regulations;
- Able to provide a police check as per position requirements;
- Have Ontario G or G2 driver's license as per position requirements;
- Post-secondary student or graduate in a field related to the position.
